

THE PRINCIPALS: Following back-to-back midweek home games, A-State is set to play both on a Saturday and on the road for the first time in almost a month. Making their first ever appearance at Hancock Whitney Stadium, the Red Wolves are coming

off a narrow 28-27 setback against Sun Belt Conference West Division-leader Louisiana. They will face a Jaguars team that stands 1-3 in league play, but its three losses have come by a combined 14 points.

HEAD COACH BUTCH JONES: Butch Jones was announced as the Red Wolves' 31st all-time head football coach on December 12, 2020. Jones not only brought 11 years of head-coaching experience at the NCAA FBS level with him to Jonesboro after previous stops leading the football programs at Tennessee (2013-17), Cincinnati (2010-12) and Central Michigan (2007-09), but he also spent the last three

During Jones' first 11 seasons serving as a head coach, his teams combined to win four conference championships, played in eight bowl games and finished ranked in the AP Top 25 five times. He has coached a combined 77 all-conference honorees and 27 NFL Draft picks.

DEBUT GAMES: Butch Jones is A-State's 31st all-time head coach, but became just the 11th to claim a victory in his first ever game at the school. Each of the two head coaches (Blake Anderson and Bryan Harsin) immediately preceding Jones won their initial games, but Harsin in 2013 was actually the first to do so since Larry Lacewell in 1979, snapping a streak of seven head coaches to drop their debuts. A-State's head coaches to win their first game at the school include Jones (2021), Anderson (2014), Harsin, Lacewell, Bill Davidson (1971), Gene Harlow (1955), Glen Harmeson (1954), Bill Adams (1939), Jack Dale (1931), Bill Stanley (1924) and Clint Young (1913). Among the same group, Davidson was the last to win his first two games in 1971.

FAMILY TIES: Research indicates that Butch Jones is one of nine FBS head coaches in the nation with a son currently playing at an FBS institution. Adam Jones, one of Jones' three sons, is currently a redshirt freshman wide receiver for the Red Wolves after transferring from Central Michigan to A-State after Jones accepted the Red Wolves' head coaching position. Jones' oldest son, Alex, is also in his first season in an offensive quality control position for the Red Wolves. His youngest son, Andrew, is a member of the freshman football team at Valley View in Jonesboro.

THE ARKANSAS STATE - SOUTH ALABAMA SERIES: Arkansas State holds a 6-3 all-time record against South Alabama in the Sun Belt Conference series that dates back to 2012. Six of the nine meetings have been decided by 10 points or less, including last season when the Jaguars won 38-31 in Jonesboro. The Red Wolves hold 2-2 record versus the Jaguars in Mobile, although those four games were played at Ladd-Peebles Stadium. The Jaguars have won the last two meetings, with the Red Wolves' last victory in the series coming 38-14 in 2018.

ALABAMA RED WOLVES: Arkansas State has eight players on its roster from the state of Alabama, in-

cluding linebackers Caleb Bonner (Reform) and Derek Bean (Pinson), safeties Antwon Fegans (Oxford), KaRon Coleman (Eutaw), Justin Parks (Gardendale) and Cam Jeffery (Tuscaloosa), tight end Emmanual Stevenson (Eufala) and offensive lineman Noah Smith (Locus Fork). Bonner and Stevenson have been regular starters for A-State this season and Bean, Jeffery and Smith join the two on the Red Wolves current depth chart.

A-STATE vs THE SUN BELT: Arkansas State has won 58 of its last 82 Sun Belt Conference games (.707 winning percentage) to run its all-time record in the league to 90-60. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against ULM with 27. A-State has defeated every team in the conference since the football league was formed in 2001. Along with ULM and Louisiana, A-State is one of three teams that have been a part of the conference since its inaugu-

ral football season.

RED WOLVES OCTOBER: Arkansas State holds a 26-12 record over its last 38 games played in the month of October for a .684 winning percentage. A-State had won 11 games in a row during the month prior to falling to Appalachian State on Oct. 9, 2018.

ON THIS DATE: Dating back to the 1931 season, Arkansas State holds a 6-2 record when playing on Oct. 30. A-State last played on the date in 1999, claiming a 31-27 home victory against Louisiana. The Red Wolves have also knocked off Lamar (1976), Murray State (1965), Southern Illinois (1948), Arkansas-Monticello (1936) and Memphis (1931) on the date.

THE FIRST FIVE: While Arkansas State began its 2021 campaign with back-to-back home games for the first time since 1987, it then played three consecutive Saturdays on the road for the first time since 2004. The Red Wolves also played three road games in a row in 2020, 2016, 2015, 2014 and 2008, but none of them on three consecutive Saturdays.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD ...: run its all-time record versus South Alabama to 7-3 . . . snap a two-game skid against the Jaguars . . . improve its record to 27-12 over its last 39 games played in the month of October.

CAREER GAME: Second-year freshman safety **Taylon Doss** put together one of the best games of his young career against Louisiana, posting a career-high 11 tackles to go along with his first two forced fumbles. His second forced fumble was recovered by teammate **Justin Parks** and set up a three-play scoring drive for the Red Wolves.

PASSING ATTACK: Including a school-record 582 passing yards against Memphis and 443 versus Georgia Southern, the eighth most in school history, Arkansas State has thrown for 2,440 yards and 20 touchdowns this season. The Red Wolves are averaging 348.6 passing yards per game that ranks eighth in the nation, while their 20 passing touchdowns are tied for the 11th most. A-State has thrown for at least 300 yards and two scores in five of its first seven games, including the UCA, Memphis, Tulsa, Georgia Southern and Louisiana contests.

RUNNING BACK RECEPTIONS: Running back **Lincoln Pare** has already caught 18 passes for 144 yards this season, which is 59 more yards than he had for all of last season as a true freshman. He's ranked fourth on the team in receptions and fifth in receiving yards. His 18 catches are also six more than his career total entering the year. Pare finished the Washington game with seven catches for 69 yards -- both career highs.

ON THE RETURN: A-State running back **Johnnie Lang Jr.** posted a career-long 63-yard punt return for a touchdown during A-State's game at Tulsa, which was A-State's first punt return for a score since Blaise Taylor also found the end zone on a 63-yard return against Nebraska in 2017. It was the longest return by a Sun Belt player this season, and he now has nine returns for 120 yards.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE: Although the Arkansas State defense collected its first turnover last week since its game against Tulsa, it finished with multiple turnovers gained for the fourth time this year. The Red Wolves have now won or tied the turn-

interceptions and Reimonenq two, while the other four players have posted their first pick this year as a member of the A-State football team.

DISRUPTING THE BACKFIELD: Junior defensive end **Kivon Bennett** has made an immediate impact on the A-State defense his first season with the program, already posting 11.0 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. The Tennessee transfer has recorded 1.0 or more TFL in every game and at least a half sack in five outings.

DYNAMIC DUO: A-State's two starting defensive ends, **Jojo Ozougwu** and **Kivon Bennett**, have combined for 20.0 tackles for loss and 9.0 sacks through A-State's first seven games. Both players have recorded 4.5 sacks this year, and Ozougwu has posted 9.0 tackles for loss to go along with Bennett's 11.0 stops behind the line of scrimmage.

EXPERIENCE UP FRONT: Arkansas State entered the season with nine different offensive linemen who had combined to start 149 career games at the FBS level, which was the fourth most in the nation behind only Minnesota (180), Miami (159) and Michigan State (151). Including players who have started at least one FCS game, the Red Wolves had 10 o-linemen who combined for 157 career starts, which was also the fourth most in the nation behind Illinois (193), Minnesota (180) and Miami (159).

LAMAR EARNS SBC WEEKLY AWARD: Senior running back Alan Lamar, who most recently posted a career-high 185 kickoff return yards that were the third most in school history, was named the Sun Belt Special Teams Player of the Week following the Tulsa contest. During the game against the Golden Hurricane, he recorded a 93-yard return that tied the ninth longest in A-State history and was the second longest by a Sun Belt player this season. It marked the first time since 2019 that an A-State player returned a kickoff for a touchdown.

RUCKER HONORED: Wide receiver Corey Rucker was named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 after recording nine receptions for 138 yards and three touchdowns against UCA. He was also named the league's offensive player of the week following the Red Wolves' 2020 season finale. Over his last eight games played, he has recorded 44 receptions for 860 yards and 12 touchdowns -- he has at least one TD reception in six of those seven outings.

HOME SWEET HOME: Arkansas State strung together 16 consecutive years from 2005-20 with a winning record at Centennial Bank Stadium. The Red Wolves are now 72-22 (.766 winning percentage) when playing at home since the 2005 season. A-State's actual on-field record all-time at Centennial Bank Stadium is 164-85-1 since it opened in 1974.

A LOOK BACK: A-State's first spring camp under HC Butch Jones wrapped up April 17 with its spring game at Centennial Bank Stadium. There were several spring-camp team awards presented as the football staff chose five individuals who maintained consistent success on the field, in the weight room and in the classroom. The players recognized for "consistency in performance" were wide receiver Corey

Rucker (offense), linebacker Caleb Bonner (defense) and kicker Blake Grupe (special teams). Senior safety EJ Alexander was awarded the "Pack Performance Award" for his consistent performance in the weight room. Defensive back Taylon Doss was issued the 4-6/A to B" award for his performance on special teams in the secondary.

IT'S GOOD: Junior kicker Blake Grupe continues to climb the A-State record books this season, ranking among the top three players in career points scored, field goals made and extra points made. Grupe has posted a double-digit points total in three of seven games this season, including a career-high 14 against Memphis. Grupe is 10-of-14 on field goals attempts this season, including a career-long covering 50 yards against Tulsa.

INSIDE THE 20: Ryan Hanson has posted at least two punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line in five of seven games this year, including a career-high four against Washington. His 16 total punts inside the 20 leads the Sun Belt Conference. Additionally, his 43.3 average per punt is a full three yards per attempt better than his 40.3 average a year ago.

BUTCH JONES HEAD COACH | 1ST SEASON

Dutch land was annumed as

Butch Jones was announced as the Red Wolves' 31st all-time head football coach on December 12, 2020.

Jones not only brought 11 years of head-coaching experience at the NCAA FBS level with him to Jonesboro after previous stops leading the football programs at Tennessee (2013-17), Cincinnati (2010-12) and Central

Michigan (2007-09), but he also spent the last three seasons (2018-20) working as part of Nick Saban's staff at national-power Alabama.

During Jones' first 11 seasons serving as a head coach, his teams combined to win four conference championships, played in eight bowl games and finished ranked in the AP Top 25 five times. He coached a combined 77 all-conference honorees and 27 NFL Draft picks, including All-Pro selections Alvin Kamara, Travis Kelce and Antonio Brown.

Jones served as the Special Assistant to the Head Coach at Alabama last season, helping the Crimson Tide post an unblemished 13-0 record on their way to claiming the National Championship. He was also an offensive analyst for the program in 2018 and 2019 as it compiled a combined 25-3 record. The 2018 team played in the CFP national championship game, while the 2019 squad capped off the year with a 35-16 win over Michigan in the Citrus Bowl to finish ranked No. 8 in the final AP Top 25 poll.

Prior to Alabama, Jones spent a five-year stint at the University of Tennessee, collecting 34 wins and leading the Volunteers to bowl wins three times. He inherited a program that hadn't won a bowl game since 2007 and proceeded to direct the Vols to three consecutive bowl game victories for the first time in over 20 years (1994-96).

Focusing on the complete student-athlete, Jones helped mentor over 200 academic all-conference winners and 100-plus academic honor roll recipients while in Knoxville. Under his direction, every academic record in Tennessee history was broken with 85-plus players earning their degrees.

Jones took over the Tennessee program after spending the 2010-12 seasons as Cincinnati's head coach. The Bearcats compiled a 23-14 record in his three seasons while also winning the Big East title in 2011 and 2012. Jones was named the league's Coach of the Year after Cincinnati's 10-win season in 2011, while also earning the same honor from CBSSports.com in 2012 after his squad captured its second consecutive bowl victory and finished in the Top 25.

Jones was also the head coach at Central Michigan from 2007-09, winning 27 contests and leading the Chippewas to the 2007 and 2009 Mid-American Conference (MAC) titles. His three-year stint in Mount Pleasant saw Central Michigan compile a 22-3 MAC record, make three consecutive bowl-game appearances and post a No. 23 postseason raking in 2009. Jones was the only head coach to lead the program to consecutive bowl games, as well as the first in the history of the MAC to do so in his first three seasons.

Prior to making his second stop at Central Michigan, Jones was the wide receivers coach at West Virginia from 2005-06. While coaching in Morgantown, WVU combined to post a 22-3 record, including a Sugar Bowl win over Georgia. Jones served as an assistant at Central Michigan for seven years from 1998-2004. During that time, he served as offensive coordinator (2001-03), running backs coach (2000-2004), wide receivers (1999) and as tight ends coach (1998).

He was also the offensive coordinator at his alma mater, Ferris State, from 1995-97 and at Wilkes University from 1993-94 while also serving

as an assistant at Rutgers from 1990-92. His original entry into the coaching ranks was as an intern with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 1987-89.

Jones is a 1990 graduate of Ferris State University in Michigan, where he was a two-year letterman on the football team. Jones and his wife, Barb, are the parents of three sons – Alex, Adam and Andrew.

JONESBORO, Ark. (9/4/21) – It was a tale of two halves in the inaugural game of the Butch Jones era as Arkansas State overcame a 7-6 halftime deficit to defeat Central Arkansas 40-21 at Centennial Bank Stadium.

Layne Hatcher led the second-half charge, completing all 12 of his passes on the night for 150 yards and four touchdowns. A-State outscored UCA 34-14 in the last 30 minutes of play to win its season opener for the first time since 2018. The win also made Jones the third consecutive A-State head coach to win his first game at the helm.

"I liked the way they responded, but didn't like the way we started," Jones said. "I think we experienced everything negative that you could experience in a first half. We talked about the DNA of our football team and the ability to persevere. We definitely didn't play winning football and have a lot to learn from, but we came out in the second half and finally played complementary football. I said I'd learn a lot about this team tonight, and we have a lot of things to work on to get better. We know, with the schedule coming up, that we have to get better in a hurry."

Hatcher's performance made him the seventh FBS quarter-back since 2000 to go 100 percent passing in 12 or more attempts in a game. He is also one of three in that group of QBs with four or more touchdown passes among those 12 passes.

A-State racked up 513 yards of total offense, including 319 passing, with starter James Blackman going 16-for-26 and 169 yards. Corey Rucker was a top target, grabbing nine passes for 138 yards and three scores while newcomer Te'Vailance Hunt caught six passes for 96 yards and a touchdown. The Red Wolves found success on the ground as well, churning out 194 yards led by Alan Lamar's 67 yards.

"Layne came in and really sparked us," Jones added. "Then we got Corey Rucker involved and he made some big plays for us. I thought Jeff Foreman stepped up and made some big plays, and (Hunt) did as well. We were able to wear them down running the ball. We talk about winning the fourth quarter and making conditioning a factor, and those are some things we can build upon."

UCA struck first on a 66-yard pass from Breylin Smith to Chris Richmond before A-State responded with a pair of field goals off the leg of Blake Grupe to make it 7-6 at the half.

A-State took advantage of prime field position after a 29-yard punt return by Johnnie Lang Jr. to move ahead 13-7 midway through the third on a 2-yard plunge by Lamar. That lead expanded to 20-7 later in the quarter when Hatcher linked up with Rucker for a 34-yard strike that capped off an eight-play, 91-yard drive.

The Bears responded on the ensuing drive when Smith found Lujuan Winningham for a 7-yard scoring strike with 31 seconds left in the quarter to cut A-State's lead to 20-14 after three quarters.

Two more Hatcher-to-Rucker scores bookended a Samy Johnson interception and handed the Red Wolves a 33-14 lead with over 11 minutes left in the contest. UCA then closed out its night with Smith and Winningham reconnecting for a 14-yard score to make it 33-21 with 7:33 to go. A-State closed out the scoring when Hatcher found Hunt from 5 yards out with 2:48 to go, sealing the victory.

Sept. 11, 2021 | Centennial Bank Stadium: 19,501 | A-State 50, Memphis 55



JONESBORO, Ark. (9/11/21) – Driving down the field in the final seconds seeking a come-from-behind win, a deep pass to the end zone fell incomplete for the Arkansas State football team, which dropped a 55-50 decision to Memphis at Centennial Bank Stadium.

Fans of offensive outbursts were satisfied, with the teams combining for 1,361 total yards, as A-State (1-1) out-gained the Tigers (2-0) by one yard, 681-680. The Red Wolves racked up a single-game record 584 yards through the air while Memphis recorded 417 passing yards to 263 yards on the ground.

"I'm really proud of our players," head coach Butch Jones said. "They had every opportunity to get out of the game and they kept fighting. We talked all week long about it being a four-quarter game and playing through four quarters, and we had an opportunity to win at the end. I thought our team showed a competitive spirit and they were relentless competitors. There are no moral victories, but I thought there were things to build upon."

A-State's quarterback pair of Layne Hatcher and James Blackman combined to complete 42 of 66 passes on the day with five scores and no interceptions. Both the completion and attempts total were second most in school history. Hatcher went 23 of 38 for 276 yards and a score, while Blackman connected on 19 of 28 passes for 308 yards and 4 touchdowns, all in the second half.

Two A-State receivers recorded 100-yard outings, led by Jeff Foreman's eight catches for 198 yards. Te'Vailance Hunt grabbed a team-high 9 receptions for 123 yards. Five different receivers scored for the Red Wolves, including Foreman, Hunt, Corey Rucker, Adam Jones and Akeem Hayes.

Memphis quarterback Seth Henigan completed 22 of 33 passes for 417 yards and 5 touchdowns, while Calvin Austin III caught six of those passes for 239 yards and three scores. Sean Dykes racked up 143 yards on nine catches and two scores. On the ground, Brandon Thomas led the charge, churning out

191 yards on 18 attempts and 2 touchdowns. Six of the Tigers' eight scores went 40 yards or longer.

Memphis opened up with 13 unanswered with a pair of Henigan touchdown passes to Austin III and Dykes. Hunt put A-State on the board with a 53yard scoring grab on which he batted the ball over his defender, caught it, and scampered untouched to the end zone to make it 13-7.

The Tigers responded two plays later with a 70-yard rushing touchdown by Thomas. After recovering a fumble on Memphis' next drive, the Red Wolves converted the field position into points with a career-long 48-yard field goal by Blake Grupe. Memphis led 20-10 after the opening quarter.

A-State took advantage of another Tiger turnover in the second, turning a muffed punt into a 37-yard field goal by Grupe to make it 20-13. Dykes found the end zone again with just over 5 minutes left in the half on a 40-yard scoring grab to make it 27-13. A-State cut it to 27-20 with 1:30 to go when Hatcher scampered for a 12-yard score, but then the Tigers responded with a 75-yard run by Thomas on their next play from scrimmage. The Red Wolves tacked on a 34-yard field goal by Grupe to end the half with Memphis leading 34-23.


Memphis added a 50-yard pass from Henigan to Austin III to make it a three-score affair. Later in the third, Blackman entered and executed a quick scoring drive, finding Rucker in the back right corner of the end zone for a 23-yard strike. The Tigers clung to a 41-30 lead entering the fourth quarter.

After Memphis upped its lead to 48-30 on a 4-yard rush by Marquavius Weaver, Blackman found Foreman for an 89-yard toss two plays later. The 2-point try was successful, but nullified due to an illegal forward pass to make it 48-36. Henigan then found Austin III for a third time on a 75-yard pass before A-State battled back to make it a one-score game with 14 unanswered.

Blackman found Jones for a one-yard score with 4:03 to go and the A-State defense forced the Tigers to punt. The South Bay, Fla., native then piloted the offense down the field for an 83-yard drive capped off by a 9-yard pass to Hayes to make it 55-50 with less than 2 minutes remaining. After the Tigers recovered an onside kick, A-State forced a punt to set up a potential game-winning drive in the final minute. Blackman completed four passes with the clock ticking, but a deep pass to the end zone fell to the turf.

Sept. 18, 2021 | Husky Stadium: 58,772 | Washington 52, A-State 3



SEATTLE, Wash. (9/18/21) – On a rainy afternoon at Husky Stadium, Arkansas State dropped a 52-3 decision at Washington.

The Huskies surged to a 35-0 lead before A-State got on the board, but that deficit was too much to overcome for the Red Wolves. Washington outgained A-State 598-268 while recording 30 first downs.

"(Washington) is a good football team, and any time you make mistakes it's magnified against a quality opponent, just like last week," A-State head coach Butch Jones said. "I take full responsibility. It's unacceptable, in all three phases – offense, defense and special teams. We made critical mistakes in critical stages of the game, critical plays on third and fourth downs. It's just trusting what we see and executing our scheme. Right now, we have no discipline to execute. I believe in these players, and I knew this was going to be a challenge, but we have to stay together and get better in a hurry. It's my responsibility and we're going to go back to work to get this rectified."

A-State's defense continued to display its ability to force turnovers, tallying three takeaways against the Huskies – two interceptions and a fumble recovery. The Red Wolves have now gained two or more turnovers in all three contests in 2021. Elery Alexander led all players with 10 tackles, including a forced fumble, and gained a turnover for the third straight game. Taylon Doss

James Blackman drew the starting nod under center, completing 16 of 38 passes for 176 yards. A-State totaled 220 yards through the air, as Layne Hatcher entered late, completing six of 11 passes for 44 yards. Lincoln Pare posted a career-best day receiving, hauling in seven catches for 69 yards to lead A-State in both categories.


Husky quarterback Dylan Morris completed 23 of 39 passes for 367 yards and three scores. Ten of those passes were completed to Jalen McMillan, who racked up 175 yards. The Huskies racked up 398 yards through the air, while churning out 200 yards on the ground.

Washington scored 28 unanswered in the first half on a pair of touchdown passes from Morris to Cade Otton (13 yards) and Jalen McMillan (33 yards) and rushing scores by Sean McGrew (13 yards) and Richard Newton (2 yards). The Huskies led 28-0 at intermission.

The Red Wolves kept the Huskies off the board in the second half until 4:37 left in the third, when McGrew plunged across the goal line for a 2-yard score. A-State then later got an interception by Jeffmario Brown to set up prime field position inside the Washington 30. The Red Wolves would not find the end zone, but a 26-yard field goal by Blake Grupe put them on the board to make it 35-3 after three. With his kick, Grupe moved into second all-time in program history in career points scored by kicking (290), passing Josh Arauco and is now third in most points scored in school history.

The Huskies closed out the contest with 17 fourth-quarter points. Morris found Terrell Bynum for a 42-yard score before Peyton Henry tacked on a 38-yard field goal. Washington's last score came with 3:34 to go, when Bralen Trice returned a fumble recovery 72 yards for the touchdown.

Sept. 25, 2021 | H.A. Chapman Stadium: 14,881 | Tulsa 41, A-State 34



TULSA, Okla. (9/25/21) – A second-half comeback fell short for Arkansas State at H.A. Chapman Stadium, as the Red Wolves dropped a 41-34 contest at Tulsa.

A-State trailed by as much as 17 in the contest, but cut it to a one-score game twice and scored a pair of special teams touchdowns. The Golden Hurricane churned out 663 yards in a balanced attack, passing for 355 yards and grinding out 308 on the ground behind a pair of 100-yard rushers.

"I thought we made a monumental leap this week in the way we approached the week and practiced," head coach Butch Jones said. "We knew we were coming in to play a very good football team who has played a lot of quality opponents, but our kids kept fighting. The next evolution in learning how to win games, especially on the road, is being able to withstand the mental swings and changes. I thought, at times, we didn't keep that consistent pace."

James Blackman passed for 321 yards on 23 of 37 passing for a pair of touchdowns. Corey Rucker hauled in four passes for a team-leading 115 yards. On special teams, Johnnie Lang Jr. scored on a first-quarter punt return while Alan Lamar returned a kickoff for a score in the third. Saturday marked the first time since Nov. 11, 2000, versus North Texas that A-State returned both a punt and kickoff for a score in the same game. It was also only the second time a Sun Belt Conference team accomplished the feat (Louisiana, Sept. 12, 2020, at Iowa State).

"Our special teams gave us an opportunity to win," Jones continued. "At the end of the day, it comes down to being a line-of-scrimmage game. You're not going to win a lot of games if you can't stop the run and can't run the ball. That will continue to be a point of emphasis. I'm proud of our players and I thought our team took a step forward. There are no moral victories but I can see the progress we are making. The most important game is next week at Georgia Southern and we need to get ready to go and find a way to win a football game on the road."

Defensively, Elery Alexander collected a career-best 14 tackles, while Kivon Bennett posted a monster day at defensive end with 11 tackles, 2.5 for loss. Joe Ozougwu led up front with 3.5 tackles for loss and a pair of sacks on the day.

Davis Brin completed 17 of 25 passes for 355 yards and three scores while coughing up an interception to Jarius Reimonenq in the third quarter. Two of his receivers – Josh Johnson and Sam Crawford Jr. – racked up 127 and 105 yards receiving, respectively. Crawford Jr. scored twice while JuanCarlos Santana scored once on five receptions for 99 yards.

In Tulsa's ground game, Shamari Brooks rushed 22 times for 155 yards while Anthony Watkins amassed 115 yards on just seven carries.

A-State got on the board first after a defensive stand, as Lang Jr. fielded a punt and returned it 63 yards to the house. Tulsa responded with an 88-yard touchdown pass from Brin to Crawford Jr. to tie it, but Blackman then found Dahu Green for a 39-yard strike to give the Red Wolves a 14-7 lead after one quarter.

The Golden Hurricane closed out the first half with 17 unanswered points to lead 24-14 at the break. Brooks tied it at 14 with a 25-yard rushing score before Brin connected with Santana for a 34-yard touchdown pass. Zack Long drilled a 41-yard field goal with a second remaining to end the half.

Tulsa extended its lead in the opening drive of the second half on a 17-yard pass from Brin to Crawford Jr., but A-State then began clawing back. First, Blackman found Jeff Foreman for a 7-yard strike, but the Golden Hurricane punched back on the next play with a 75-yard rushing touchdown by Watkins to make it 38-21 less than five minutes into the third.

A-State got its second special teams touchdown of the day when Lamar returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards to cut the deficit to 10 at 38-28. Blake Grupe added a 38-yard field goal to make it a one-score affair late in the third, giving Tulsa a 38-31 lead entering the fourth quarter. Long then connected again on a 45-yard kick before Grupe drilled a 50-yard field goal to make it a one-score game again.

Tulsa drove down the field in the game's final drive looking to put the game out of reach, but the clock ran out with the Golden Hurricane inside A-State's 5-yard line.

Oct. 2, 2021 | Allen E. Paulson Stadium: 16,377 | Ga. Southern 59, A-State 33



STATESBORO, Ga. (10/2/21) – The Arkansas State football team dropped a 59-33 decision at Georgia Southern in its Sun Belt Conference opener at Allen E. Paulson Stadium.

A-State passed for 443 yards, but had trouble stopping the Eagles' ground game that churned out 503 yards. All seven of Georgia Southern's offensive scores came on the ground.

"This performance was unacceptable and we made way too many mistakes," head coach Butch Jones said. "Everybody will point to the second half, but those mistakes become magnified and they started in the first half. We had an opportunity to seize momentum, but we dropped a touchdown pass, we missed a field goal and we give up a third down conversion. We then gave up an explosive play and it snowballed from there. They dominated the lines of scrimmage and it's really hard to do anything when that happens and it will not be accepted in our program."

James Blackman complete 28 of 43 passes for 292 yards and two scores, while Layne Hatcher completed 8 of 18 for 151 yards and two touchdowns. Corey Rucker led 12 different A-State pass-catchers with seven catches for 86 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, Jarius Reimonenq posted a team-high 12 tackles, a career high for the Hattiesburg, Miss., native. Caleb Bonner also tallied a career high in tackles with 10.

Logan Wright led the Eagles' rushing attack with 208 yards on 10 carries, while Jalen White added 157 yards on 14 attempts.

Georgia Southern opened up the scoring with a 59-yard rushing score by Wright before A-State got on the board via a 31-yard field goal by Blake Grupe. The Eagles led 10-3 after the first quarter, with Alex Raynor drilling a 25-yard kick with just over a minute left in the period.

A-State tied it at 10 when Blackman found Rucker for a short 2-yard touchdown pass, but the Eagles found the end zone on the next drive on a 23-yard scamper by Gerald Green. Georgia Southern continued to churn out yardage to score 14 unanswered to end the half, as Wright and J.D. King scored from 41 and 5 yards, respectively, giving the Eagles a 31-19 lead at the half.

Georgia Southern continued to score in the second half with rushing scores by Justin Tomlin (6 yards) and White (59 yards) and a pick-six by Quin Williams to lead 52-19 early in the fourth. Hatcher found Dahu Green (16 yards) and Lincoln Pare (13 yards) for a pair of scores to cut it to 52-33, but a 47-yard score by White closed things out for the Eagles.

Oct. 7, 2021 | Centennial Bank Stadium: 12,086 | Coastal Carolina 52, A-State 20



JONESBORO, Ark. (10/7/21) – On Thursday night game at Centennial Bank Stadium, Arkansas State scored 20 second-half points, but dropped a 52-20 decision to No. 15 Coastal Carolina.

A-State (1-5, 0-2 SBC) became the first team to score a passing touchdown on the Chanticleers (6-0, 2-0), but could not overcome a 31-0 third-quarter deficit. The Red Wolves passed for 255 yards, while Coastal Carolina racked up 685 yards of total offense - 391 passing, 294 rushing.

"We have to learn what it is to compete," head coach Butch Jones said. "I didn't feel, when we walked down the ramp during the Red Wolf Walk, that this football team believed they could win. They had a different look in their eye, and that's unacceptable. Then, we get hit in the mouth and then we decide that we can play with them. For moments in the second half, we did that but couldn't sustain momentum. We would score but couldn't force a 3-and-out, and that's how you overtake a game and come back from a deficit. I was very disappointed in everything, from our execution to our mental intensity. We have to learn how to compete."

Layne Hatcher completed 13 of 29 passes for 185 yards and two scores in place of starter James Blackman, who completed seven of 12 passes for 70 yards. Te'Vailance Hunt was A-State's

top target, hauling in six catches for 138 yards.

Corey Rucker also caught a touchdown, running his career total to 12, which is tied for ninth most in program history.

Chanticleer quarterback Grayson McCall completed 78.3 percent of his passes (18 of 23) for 365 yards and four scores on the night, with all four scores going to tight end Isaiah Likely, who grabbed 8 passes for 232 yards. On the ground, Shermari Jones rushed 10 times for 113 yards to lead CCU.

Coastal Carolina wasted no time getting on the board. After a Ryan Hanson punt landed them inside their 1-yard line, Mc-Call found Likely for a 99-yard touchdown pass on the second play of the drive. The Chanticleers later added a 19-yard field goal by Massimo Biscardi to lead 10-0 after one quarter.

The Chanticleers added 14 more before the half on an 8-yard rushing touchdown by Jones and a 4-yard pass from McCall to Likely with 13 seconds remaining. Coastal Carolina led 24-0 at halftime.

Coastal Carolina took the ball to start the second half and scored on another McCall-to-Likely connection, this time for 16 yards to make it 31-0. A-State then got on the board on its next drive when Hatcher found Rucker for a 15-yard strike in the back of the end zone, marking the first passing TD of the year allowed by the Chanticleers' defense. After McCall found Likely for the fourth time of the night for a 64-yard strike, A-State punched back when Hatcher connected with Hunt for a 63-yard touchdown. Coastal Carolina led 38-14 after three.

A-State cut it to 38-20 early in the fourth when Lincoln Pare plunged across the goal for a 1-yard score, but the two-point try was no good. The Chanticleers turned to the ground game for their final two scores by Reese White (64 yards) and backup quarterback Bryce Carpenter (67 yards).

JONESBORO, Ark. (10/21/21) – Arkansas State showed tremendous grit in a back-and-forth affair, but ultimately was edged 28-27 by Louisiana at Centennial Bank Stadium in a Thursday night game nationally televised on ESPNU.

A-State held the Ragin' Cajuns scoreless after one quarter, and nearly matched Louisiana score for score until a late touchdown pulled the visitors ahead. The Red Wolves won the turnover battle, gaining a pair of takeaways from the Cajuns while not turning the ball over.

"It's all about winning games and playing winning football, but I thought our whole team changed this week," head coach Butch Jones said. "We changed our mindset at practice, at the hotel (before the game). It was a different team and that's something to build upon. The fight and grit of this team showed. They're battered and beat up, but they showed a lot of heart. I thought we took a step forward in our culture this week and we took one of the perennial powers in this league (down to the wire). Our kids laid it on the line tonight."

Layne Hatcher completed 16 of 31 passes for 300 yards, 3 touch-downs and no interceptions, with Te'Vailance Hunt racking up 83 yards on 3 catches. Corey Rucker also notched a score on 3 catches for 53 yards while Emmanual Stevenson recorded his first career touchdown grab.

On the ground, A-State churned out 113 yards, marking the second time this season the Red Wolves surpassed the 100-yard mark rushing. Lincoln Pare led the charge with 52 yards on 11 carries.

Defensively, Elery Alexander led all players with 12 tackles (9 solo)

while Taylon Doss racked up 11 tackles (8 solo). Joe Ozougwu tallied 8 stops, including a sack and 3 tackles for loss, and Kenneth Harris nabbed an interception. As a team, the A-State defense posted 7 tackles for loss.

Louisiana quarterback Levi Lewis completed 11 of 20 passes for 122 yards. But it was on the ground where the Cajuns made their mark, totaling 424 yards and averaging 8.0 yards per carry. Chris Smith led the way with 238 yards and 2 touchdowns on 24 rushes for a 9.9-yard average. Montrell Johnson also scored twice, rushing for 150 yards on 17 carries.

The teams were scoreless in the first quarter, with A-State aided by a big goal-line stand to force a turnover on downs at the 2. It marked the first time this season that the Red Wolves had held an opponent scoreless in the first quarter.

A-State drew first blood with 5:38 left in the first half when Hatcher capped off a 12-play, 94-yard drive by finding Rucker in the end zone to make it 7-0. Louisiana tied things up on its next play from scrimmage after starting on its own 1, as Johnson scampered for a 99-yard score.

A-State added a 32-yard field goal by Blake Grupe with 2:21 left in the half to reclaim a 10-7 lead, but the Ragin' Cajuns closed strong to take a 14-10 halftime lead on a 6-yard rushing touchdown by Smith. The Red Wolves crossed midfield in the waning seconds, but a deep pass toward the end zone fell to the turf to end the half.

The Red Wolves took the ball to open the second half and it only took two plays for them to retake the lead, as Hatcher linked up with Hunt for a 76-yard touchdown pass to make it 17-14 early in the third. Louisiana responded on the next drive with a 3-yard rushing score by Johnson to lead 21-17.

After A-State recovered a fumble near midfield, Hatcher found Stevenson for a 15-yard strike to make it 24-21 with just over 9 minutes remaining in the third. Grupe then added a 35-yard field goal to up that lead to 27-21 with 3:23 left in the quarter.

Smith then scored his second touchdown of the day, this one from 74 yards out, to give the Cajuns a 28-27 edge entering the fourth quarter. Louisiana closed it out in the fourth with a 20-play, 90-yard drive to end the contest.
